



Pupil Premium Review 2019/20

The Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) is additional funding provided by the Department for Education to enhance the education experience of financially disadvantaged students. PPG provides funding to support one key aim, which is to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils of all abilities to reach their potential.

The amount of Pupil Premium funding allocated to Sidestrand Hall School for the 2019/20 academic year was £99,560.

This figure is calculated as follows:

44% of students at Sidestrand Hall School are entitled to Pupil Premium of which 4% are looked after children (LAC) and 5% are post looked after children (PLAC).

According to the Education and Skills Funding Agency, the PPG can be spent in the following ways:

- For the purposes of the school, that is for the educational benefit of pupils registered at that school. For the benefit of pupils registered at other maintained schools or academies.
- On community facilities, for example, services whose provision further any charitable purpose for the benefit of pupils at the school or their families, or people who live or work in the locality in which the school is situated

The grant does not have to be completely spent by schools in the financial year beginning 1 April 2019, some or all of it may be carried forward to future financial years. It is also important to note that this funding is not ring-fenced and is not for individual children.

PUPIL PREMIUM STRATEGIES

The pupil Premium was used to support the learning of all vulnerable students in the following ways:-

Impact of the PPG

- Overall school attendance in 2019/20 was 92.98 %. Non-PP Students' attendance was 95.79 % and PP students' attendance was 90.86 %.
- 100% of PP students who left the school in the summer of 2020 went on to further education or employment. All remain in their new settings at the point of writing, indicating that transition was successful.
- Percentage of PP students that made good or outstanding progress in Maths - Whole School - 100%
- Percentage of PP students that made good or outstanding progress in English - Whole School - 100%
- Percentage of PP students that made good or outstanding progress in Maths and English in KS2 - 100%
- Percentage of PP students that made good or outstanding progress in Maths and English in KS3 - 97%
- Percentage of PP students that made good or outstanding progress in Maths and English in Yr. 11 - 96% awarded ELC 1 or above

Recommendations

- Ensure that Clicker 8 and other alternate ways of working are established across the school
- Use Solar data analysis to constantly monitor the progress of PP students
- Monitor reading of PP students through Accelerated Reader
- Delivering and evaluating strategy groups, to achieve objectives on students' EHCPs, through the delivery of specific interventions, e.g. Fine Motor Skills, Concentration Skills, and Sensory Circuits etc.
