Allergy Aware School

We are no longer a nut free school. Instead we recognise that there are numerous potentially harmful allergens on our site. Staff and students are educated in how to keep themselves and their peers safe in reducing cross contamination and recognising the signs if someone is having an allergic reaction. Students are discouraged from sharing food and snacks and are encouraged to regularly wash their hands and surfaces before and after eating. We hold a supply of Piriton liquid antihistamine on site but will











Chestnut Class


now. In DT we have been designing and constructing clocks learning lots of new skills along the way. We are looking forward to the holidays now and a good rest. Merry Christmas to everyone.




the rescued animals were being cared for. Michael and Alfie have been cooking in the
