<b>English</b>	<b>Food Technology</b>	
During the first half of the term pupils will investigate a hobby or interest of their own and create a presentation to show the the rest of the class. Following this they will learn about personal finance and the importance of keeping passwords and personal information safe.	Pupils will develop their culinary skills cooking a variety of accessible recipes that are healthy and nourishing whilst learning how to keep themselves safe and hygienic in the kitchen.	Design and Technology projects for this term focus on nature and winter weaving including making bug hotels and weaving frames for natural resources to allow is to make local products.

During the autumn term the class will focus on looking at the areas of number and place value, addition and subtraction, as well as learning about 2D and 3D shapes in geometry. The class studies an AQA about Different races and religions of people in the world, Why people need to work together and how countries work together to solve a common problem, finishing with The story of Malala Yousafzai	The focus of the first term is learning all about our place in the world, our surroundings and how we relate to others. Following this the class look at Personal Skills and Qualities, Hobbies and Interests and Skills for Jobs	Local Nature is the focus for the first term with lots of creative challenges including Leaf printing, Repeating patterns, Flower pressing, Natural dyes, Pebble art, Tree bark rubbings, Colour mixing and Sponge printing

The class looks at how daily routines help us shape and control our lives and take part in the wider community in a safe and responsible manner.	Pupils begin by studying how to engage in respectful and safe relationships with people before moving on to understand the changes that occur during puberty and how they affect us and the people around us.
