English	Options - Creative Arts Award	Options - Cooking
In the Autumn Term, students will reading and working on texts around the theme of War and Conflict. They will continue to work towards their Entry Level Certificate in English and will be developing skills in reading, writing and speaking and listening.	The pupils will be begin their Arts award project. This term they will be experimenting with drawing and colour mixing techniques to create portraits. they will study the work of other artists and look to use their techniques and style within their own paintings. The pupils will also take part in a trip to a local museum to study artworks by other artists.	This term the pupils will begin with health and safety. They will make simple dishes using basic skills. After half term they will make cakes and pastries in the run up to Christmas.
Mathematics	P.E.	Options - Construction
Pupils continue to follow the Entry Level and Level 1 Edexcel Maths qualification. This term we work on, measuring, time, number, algebra, ratio and proportion. Some pupils may complete their first test at the end of this term.	The pupils will be playing Tag Rugby and Football with the aim of developing their confidence to ask and answer questions in group discussions when asked. Also, improve skills such as more consistently knowing when to either pass, run or take a shot/score with the ball under pressure and to develop playing within a team.	In construction pupils will be learning and using the following skills: To measure work areas. To mix mortar by hand or with a mechanical mixer. To use a trowel to lay bricks and mortar. Shape and trim bricks using hammers, chisels and power tools. Check that rows are straight using a spirit level and plumb line.
Science	Independent Living	Topic
Pupils will learn about different living organisms and how they interact with one another and the wider world. They will continue working towards one of their units for their entry level science award. The pupils will take part in practical and theory based sessions to produce their own experiments on this topic.	Pupils will be continuing to develop their knowledge and understanding about the world of work. Some of the tasks the pupils will be learning about are C.V. writing, applying for a job and preparing and taking part in a interview.	Pupils will follow an AQA unit on World War Two. They will immerse themselves in what life was like during the War, handling artefacts, learning about rations, the roles of women and men and listening to war time music. They will then focus on the defence sites that were used, describing their features and their functions.
Computer Science	RSHE	Duke of Edinburgh
Pupils will learn about being safe online with regards to cybersecurity. Pupils will learn about knowing and understanding implications of sharing personal information and when personal information may be stored by devices. Sessions concerned with methods of protecting devices and data.	Pupils will look at Self-Care, Support and Safety. We will explore the importance of using social media responsibly including a focus on sharing information and concentrating on identifying private and public information. We will also learn about the risks involved with gambling online and strategies and support that is available. The second part of the term will focus on managing pressure and recognising and dealing with peer pressure. This will be done through the context of county lines and gangs.	Pupils will be workingtowards their physical and voluleenteeing units. They will get oppurtunities to try paddle boarding and will take part in local beach cleans. The pupils will also be taking part in a practice two day camp.
