Residential Access to Risky Areas Policy

1. Introduction

- 1.1 At any school, there are bound to be areas within the buildings or the grounds that are considered to present risks to the safety of pupils who may accidentally or deliberately stray into them. This policy outlines Sidestrand Hall School procedures for controlling or denying unauthorised access by boarding pupils to potentially dangerous or risky areas of the school buildings and grounds.

 - Missing Child Policy and Procedure
 - All relevant risk assessments

2. Procedures

- 2.1 Sidestrand Hall School makes every effort to ensure that all potentially dangerous areas are, wherever possible, made secure by fencing, locking or otherwise physically preventing access to them. Areas temporarily out of bounds are fenced or cordoned off and appropriate warning notices are placed to describe the danger.
- 2.2 Some of the school grounds away from the main buildings, such as the school field, are unlit and hence unauthorised access to these areas is prohibited during the hours of darkness without staff supervision. Boarding pupils are informed or reminded regularly by residential staff of the dangers of entering riskier areas of the school.
- 2.3 Parts of the buildings containing hazards are secured with keypad entry systems or pad locks. It is the responsibility of all residential staff to ensure that codes and keys are kept securely at all times and cannot be accessed by unauthorised persons or by boarding pupils.
- 2.4 All risky areas are designated out of bounds to boarding pupils unless supervised by residential staff.
- 2.5 The Site Manager on behalf of the Head Teacher will conduct a Risk Assessment of the site boundaries on an annual basis. The Site Manager/Site Team is responsible for checking the condition of the site boundaries and buildings. Reporting any concerns to the School Business Manager/Head Teacher immediately and taking remedial action where possible.

3. Unsupervised access by Boarding pupils

3.1 At Sidestrand Hall School we ensure that all pupils do not have unsupervised access to potentially dangerous areas, such as the site store rooms or boiler room. Doors to these areas are kept locked at all times when not in use. All flammables and chemicals are kept securely locked in appropriate storage facilities. Boarding pupils are not allowed to use sporting equipment without supervision.

- 3.2 During the school day boarding pupils are out of the residential area and in school. Therefore, unless they are ill or for other reasons known to residential staff, they are not permitted in the residential area during school hours. Day pupils are not permitted in the residential accommodation.
- 3.3 There are areas of the school site which are out of bounds to boarding pupils which are only accessed with residential staff supervision. Or where a comprehensive risk assessment has been completed. These areas include:
