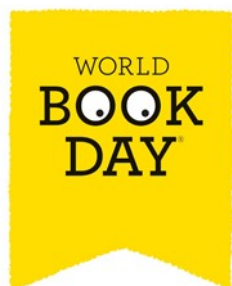

English

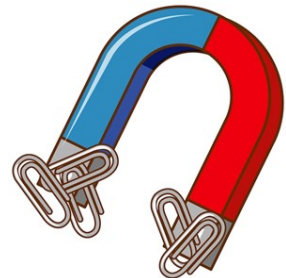
