Maths

Our maths will follow the Mastery Approach and we will be continuing to practice our basic arithmetic operations. We will also revisit the *Time* topic and apply this to our daily lives, including timetables. We will also trial an entry level test at an appropriate point (practice or actual).

English - Once we finish the shadow puppet play, we will start our non-fiction unit based around Fossils. Children will learn how to find and present information. We visit West Runton Beach and go to Roarr! Dinosaur Park. The children will write recounts, reviews and answer phone enquiries as

customer services. Our book is the wonderful Journey to the Last River - a mystery tale written as an adventurer's diary with the most beautiful illustrations. Don't forget the theatre trip on the 24th to see The Boy at the Back of the Class.

We will be looking at managing finances this term - including advertising, budgeting, saving and consumer rights. Next is Mental well being and the

penultimate unit of physical activity - the benefits and challenging stereotypes and barriers around physical activity. Finally we look at healthy eating with a focus on high sugar and caffeine food and drinks and the influences around food choices.

Science—The students will continue working towards their ELC qualification. We will continue our physics unit learning about contact and non-contact forces, as well as the different stores and transfers of energy. The students will take part in various practical experiments, including designing and carrying out an investigation into the factors which affect friction.
