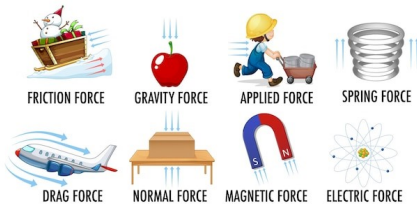
English

We have now begun working on the actual exams, with children completing their fiction and non-fiction writing pieces. There will be lots of work preparing for the reading exams which we can take as soon as we feel the children are ready. The theatre visit is coming up in April which is promising to be a great experience - we are so looking forward to it.

RSHE

This term we will be looking at impacts on body image and how it's linked to self esteem and feelings. Secondly is medicinal drugs and how these should be used responsibly and safely. We will cover the drugs, alcohol and smoking unit. Focusing on risks or illegal substances, pressures people feel around their use and how to manage influences. We will look at vaping and the influences and consequences.

TYPES OF FORCE



Science

The students will continue working towards their ELC qualification. We will be completing their various bits of coursework and preparing for the tests. The students will cover topics such as forces and friction, then use this information to carry out an investigation and analyse their findings.

PE

Hazel class will be practising their Athletics skills in preparation for Sports Day. They will learn to master basic movements including running, jumping, throwing as well as developing balance, agility and coordination, and begin to apply these in a range of activities. Hazel class will also be trying out some footgolf.
