English	RE	Art
In digital literacy the pupils will be learning about logging on/passwords, using powerpoint – presentation skills, inserting pictures and photos and research skills - the skills needed to find information, for example scanning, skimming, summarising etc. They will also be involved in creative digital storytelling.	The focus on RE this term is learning all about the need for rules and how these are represented both in our country and different settings.	This term Maple class will be investigating the artist Kandinsky and recreating some of his work using circles as a base for their art.
Mathematics	P.E.	Food Technology
This term the students will continue developing their numeracy skills at an appropriate level according to their ability and progress, as well as looking at measuring length and height, mass and volume.	Pupils will develop their skills in a variety of sports including badminton, volleyball, football and netball. They will also start practicing for the school cross country competition later in the term.	Theory lessons will look at the different sources of food staples, how they are grown and harvested. Whilst cooking pupils will be investigating the different uses of rice and pasta in national dishes as well as cultural and seasonal cuisine.

In a link to Outdoor Learning, this term Maple class students will be continuing their wildlife construction theme by designing and making Hedgehog houses.	This term the class will be focussing on healthy eating. What is a healthy diet? What does a well balanced diet consist of? What happens to our body if we have a poor diet? What does my diet look like? Let's be sugar smart. Tooth decay and what can we do to prevent this?	Music this term involves recognising a variety of percussion instruments, their sounds and how they are used in different musical styles. Pupils will also be learning how to follow a graphic score.
Self help and Independence	RSHE	Outdoor Learning
The class will be learning different cleaning techniques, accessing the correct equipment and using it safely. They will also be investigating how to make a room feel homely.	The pupils will be learning about hygiene and becoming a teenager. focusing on the following; What makes someone attractive? Do we all find the same things attractive? How do I show someone I like them? What is a girlfriend/boyfriend? When and how to wash.	Pupils will look for signs of the transition from Winter to Spring, focussing on weather patterns and different cloud formations. Classes will participate in the annual RSPB bird watch, with a focus on swallows, swifts, and housemartins. They will be planting seeds, constructing animal shelters and following trails.
