Topic - Adventure, Book - Robin Hood

We will be studying one of our favourite genres adventure. Lots of work on narrative, character and binary oppositions – good v's evil. We will be making predictions about the story, focusing on setting and the relationships between characters. What makes this old tale so appealing to audiences all over the world?

Science



This half term we will be investigating waves, such as light and sound. We will cover topics such as the similarities and differences between electromagnetic waves and water waves. The students will carry out experiments investigating how waves are reflected, absorbed and transmitted, as well as the effects these waves can have on living things.

Other subjects:

RE—Humanism: What does it mean to be Human? Is being happy the greatest purpose in life? Beech Class will discuss the kinds of things Christians view as being sinful and ask whether they are considered to be sinful by those of other religions and none.

Music/Drama— Beech Class will continue to play the recorder and sing in class. They will also attend drama lessons with Mrs Harvey in Fig Class. Several students will also be learning their lines for our Plastic Pirate performance held at the Cromer Pier.

Outdoor Learning— What is the weather? - Cloud watching, making kites and studying the wind.
