

This half term we are incredibly excited to be learning our lines for the play as well as learning the songs and dance routines ready for *Plastic Pirates*.

There are lots of lovely activities planned for World Book Day. Our book this year is *James and the Giant Peach* by Roald Dahl.

Maths

This half term we will look at multiplication, length, mass and capacity! We will also look at money and continue working with sums. We hope to use these skills on our café and library trip!





English

In English we are going to read *The Selfish Giant* by Oscar Wilde and *Skellig* by David Almond. We will be discussing the theme of change and looking at characters and how they change and develop throughout a story.

RSHE

This half term in RSHE we are going to learn about reproduction, conception and fertility. We will also discuss the importance of consent. We will really focus on expanding our listening and communication skills.

Science

In Science we are going to use ray diagrams to see how light passes through lenses and transparent materials.

ΡE

In P.E. we are going to look at racket sports and gymnastics as well as dance exercises such as Zumba and aerobics!

Other subjects:

In Topic we are staying in Asia but moving on to learning about Japan including what it's like living near a fault line and what causes earthquakes.

In Outdoor Learning we are hoping to begin planting some seeds and looking out for more signs of Spring.

In R.E. we will continue our Buddhism topic and explore the idea of karma.

In Computer Science we will be improving our digital literacy and looking at different laws we need to be aware of when using computers and digital technology.

In Art we are going to look at different lettering styles and fonts!

Other useful information



For the café and library trip pupils can bring some money (in coins ideally) to put into practice their money lessons and as a life skill. We recommend **no more** than £6 to be brought. Pupils will then have to budget when choosing what to order which is another great life skill.
