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| English | Options - Creative Arts Award | Options - Cooking |
| In Literacy this term, the students will be finishing off the last pieces of their work towards their accreditation. They will study a unit on 'People Who have Inspired Us', which will give them the chance to do some research and use their presentation skills. | The textiles group will be exploring the art and techniques of different cultures with Batik and block printing. Following this we will be creating art and textiles on the theme of Blue Planet. The Art group will be exploring how sculptures are made. Using a range of materials to plan, design and create their own. | Following our Spring term making classic and popular eating out food, we will be making food for snacks, picnics and packed lunch. | Mathematics | P.E. | Options - Construction |
| In this final term pupils will complete their coursework and those taking level 1 exams will make final preparations for this. We will then have the opportunity to work on some functional style real life maths problems such as 'Design your room' allowing pupils to consolidate what they have learnt and apply this. | Before the half term break pupils will be practicing a variety of athletics events in preparation for sports day. After the break they will be taking part in a variety of different field games. | The pupils will be constructing decorative wooden pieces/furniture, upscaling furniture to sell and bricklaying. Using skills already learnt in construction, appropriate PPE use and effective use of teamwork to work well in the workshop. |
| Science | Independent Living | Topic |
| Learn the word equation for respiration. Explain the use of vaccination in the prevention of disease. Become familiar with a diagram of the menstrual cycle. Evaluate the benefits of, and the problems that may arise from, the use of hormones to control fertility. | The focus during the summer term in independent living is knowing about different aspects of community and citizenship, including the importance of rules and laws, democracy, community and contributing to society. | This term we will be looking at biodiversity! We will explore food chains and the predator/prey relationship within an ecosystem. We will also explore the effects of habitat loss on ecosystems. |
| Computer Science | RSHE | Duke of Edinburgh |
| Pupils to complete criteria against ICT AQA award - focusing on Powerpoints using transitions, animation, formatting and addition of video and audio. Un-plugged programming activities using functions to compose music and text based programming with JavaScript. | First we look at impacts on body image and how it's linked to self esteem. Next is medicinal drugs and how these should be used responsibly and safely. We will cover the drugs, alcohol and smoking unit. Focusing on risks or illegal substances, pressures people feel around their use and how to manage influences. We will look at vaping and the influences and consequences. Finally is the Prejudice and Discrimination unit on diversity, human rights, British Values and the harm of stereotyping and how we can challenge it. | For the summer term Year 11s will be preparing for their final expedition, with training walks and prepping food. They will be taking their final assessment in May. Students have done really well and have nearly completed all of their Bronze award. |

| The focus during the summer term in enterprise is marketing and producing a range of products to be sold in the school Charity shop. | | Following on from completing the I Can Lead Award the focus of the term is to understand how to plan and write out a session plan. This is a guide in supporting the Sports Leaders to then deliver sporting activities to younger students in the school. Sports Leaders will then adapt and review their sessions to improve their planning and delivery for when they complete their final two session plans in May/June which are part of their assessment. |
