We can't believe we are in the last half term before the summer holidays. For some children this will be the last half term in Catkins.



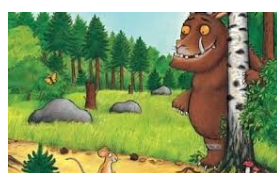
We hope to have a picnic in the school grounds before the end of the school year to celebrate Catkins Class 23/24. More details to follow shortly.

Maths

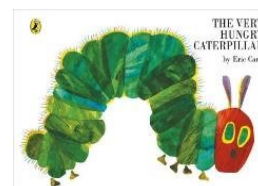

This half term we will continue with our phonics learning and explore a range of stories linked to our topic. We will use our imagination to write a story. I wonder what characters we will choose?

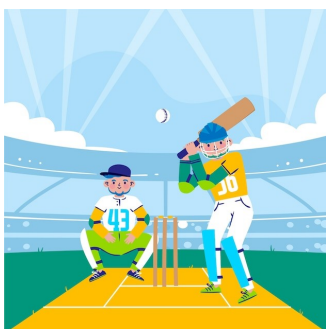


RSHE
