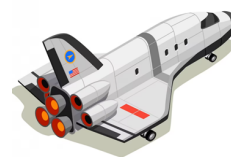

Curriculum Map - Autumn term 2025

English	Mathematics	RSHE
Students are following a Functional Skills course in English. This term we will concentrate on report writing skills on the theme of Places. We will also be practising alphabetical sorting and using a dictionary. Students will present their work as part of their speaking and listening assessment. Reading at home is a great way to support your child's learning and will enhance their writing skills.	We are following functional skills mathematics. There are three components of study starting with 'Using numbers and the number system'. Students begin with simple sums and progress to approximation, rounding, fractions and decimals. The course focuses on learning to apply Maths skills to solve real life tasks.	We are focussing on healthy lifestyles in the Autumn term, concentrating on the issues surrounding alcohol, smoking and vaping. We will also be looking at peer pressure and how to cope with it. We will go on to look at some basic first aid.
Work Experience	Careers and Life skills	Asdan Personal Development Programme
Students will be on work experience at NNDC Muddy Boots Volunteer group. Working alongside the rangers and public to help manage and conserve local beauty spots. Students will also have an opportunity to go to Strands Charity shop to experience a retail work environment.	This half term we will be exploring the world of work. Looking at what skills and qualities we have and how these can suit particular jobs. This term we are looking at what First Aid is and learn how to use it in practice. We will be moving on to look at what it means to be neurodiverse, and how it helps us to understand that everyone is different.	This half term, we are looking at Healthy Living, and how to achieve it. We will also be looking at Independent Living, looking forward to what we need to do as we become adults.
Fitness	TITAN	ICT and Online safety
We will be doing a range of Multi-skills tasks involving activities that develop fundamental movement skills like running, jumping, throwing, catching, balance, and agility, often used in a physical education context to provide a broad foundation for various sports.	We are following the TITAN independent travel programme. This term will focus on the Green Cross Code and pedestrian skills. We will be visiting local towns to practice these skills. Students will also have the opportunity to develop independence handling their own money and making their own choices, when visiting cafes.	In the Autumn term students will be learning about e-Safety related to mobile phones. Look at privacy settings, how and when to use them. Discuss the use of different Apps and explore how to use them.
Option - Sports and Leisure	Option - FoodWise	Option - Science & Robotics
This term we are looking at learning and developing skills in outdoor and indoor sports. We will also look at how to warm up, and cool down after exercise. The students will look at how to learn skills in football, rugby, basketball and hockey, and how to transform their skills into games. We are also looking at theory in sports, finding out information on various topics, e.g. how much does sports kits cost, gym fees, and where to take part in organised sporting even	In FoodWise this term we will be learning food preparation skills such as using knives and different cooking methods. We will be putting into practice food hygiene and safety knowledge whilst cooking dishes using autumn fruits. We will be cooking cakes using four different cooking methods. Students should bring in a food container to take their dishes home in.	In the Autumn term students will explore reaction times. Conduct experiments with online audio and visual tests. Carry out experiment to test the reaction time of the group. Record, analysis results and present findings.
Option - Art and Design	Option - Gardening	Option - History
In the Autumn Term, the students will be using a range of media to create personal pieces of art work based upon the theme of 'Animals'. The students will also be visiting the Norwich Castle to conduct a study of an artist's organisation.	The students are looking at different tasks in garden maintenance, different jobs for different times of the year. We are at the moment creating borders for shrubs and plants using bricks and logs to make the edging. The students are learning how to use garden tools, lawnmowers, hedge trimmers, strimmers, spades, forks etc. We are also doing theory in gardening, looking at composting, and how to make a compost bin. We are also looking at seasons and what times are best for planting.	This half term, we will be exploring Siderstrand Hall's history. We will be investigating how life has been here over the years, and are going to put together a physical museum display in the school to show our findings. We will go on to look at more local history and how the area has changed over time.
