Curriculum Map - Autumn Term 2025		
English <p>This term students will begin by looking at autobiography. They will talk and write about themselves and read some extracts from famous autobiographies. After half term, they will be reading the story of a 'A Christmas Carol' by Charles Dicks. They will also be looking at the different phonic and learning how to read and blend with these.</p>	P.E. <p>Physical Education lessons begin in the autumn term with a focus on "invasion" games such as football and tag rugby, giving pupils the opportunity to develop their team work and cooperation skills. From this they progress on to focusing on core abilities in multi-skills circuits, before finishing the term improving their performance playing basketball and hockey.</p>	RE <p>This term pupils will focus on the religion Christianity. They will examine what it means to be a Christian and why Christians describe themselves as belonging to the family of the Church. They will read some stories from the Bible to support this understanding. Pupils will learn about the symbolism of Light within the Christian Church and other religions of the world.</p>
Mathematics <p>Pupils will focus on Place Value and Number working with numbers within 100. They will partition numbers using Place Value Charts, Place Value Counters and Base 10. They will use their place value knowledge when adding and subtracting. They will then move on to the properties of 2D shape. Money and Time skills will be revisited every term.</p>	Art <p>Pupils will work on the theme of 'Colour, Shape and Pattern' before moving onto claywork in the second half term. Pupils will explore primary and secondary colours, using the work and styles of artists such as Wassily Kandinsky, Paul Klee and Keith Haring.</p>	Food Tech <p>This term we will begin by using different varieties of potatoes in various recipes, seeing how the type of potato and cooking method alters the taste of the dish. In the second part of the term the focus will be on cooking with eggs, both as the major ingredient in a recipe, as well as their addition as a binding agent and the uses of egg whites and yolks.</p>
RSHE <p>We will be exploring and labelling different emotions about moving into year seven using zones of regulation. We will also consider and describe what we are good at and/or enjoy. We will move onto identifying personal strengths and skills.</p>	Topic <p>Pupils will study the human and physical geography of Norwich and compare and contrast to that of Beijing. Pupils will build upon prior learning of the four countries that make up the UK and will explore similarities and differences between China and the UK. They will move on to look at which significant events are remembered and celebrated yearly and why.</p>	Drama and Music <p>In Music, pupils will begin with the 'Mamma Mia' Charanga unit. This unit focuses on the songs of ABBA. In Drama, they will begin by exploring emotions through role play, using expression and body language and building simple characters through scenarios.</p>
Computer Science <p>Pupils will learn to use technology purposefully to create, organise, store, manipulate and retrieve digital content in the context of using a computer program to recreate an artistic style.</p>	Science <p>Pupils will learn about physics units Solar system and forces. Ideas about the Sun, Moon, eclipses and the seasons. How planets and satellites are seen and that the Sun is a star that emits light. Unit off forces, identify friction, air resistance, upthrust and weight and describe situations in which these forces act. Chemistry units; acids and alkalis as classes of chemicals and explore simple chemical reactions.</p>	Outdoor Learning <p>The focus on outdoor learning will begin with trees, their importance to our environment and the many uses of materials we can obtain from them. Following this will be activities incorporating looking at native animals, their activities, groups and their habitats.</p>
