

It is important that your grant is used effectively and based on school need. The Education Inspection Framework makes clear there will be a focus on 'whether leaders and those responsible for governors all understand their respective roles and perform these in a way that enhances the effectiveness of the school'

Under the Quality of Education Ofsted inspectors consider: **Intent** - Curriculum design, coverage and appropriateness Implementation - Curriculum delivery, Teaching (pedagogy) and Assessment **Impact** - Attainment and progress

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of Physical Education, School Sport and Physical Activity (PESSPA) they offer. This means that you should use the Primary PE and sport premium to:

The funding should be spent by 31st July but the DfE has stated that there will be no clawback of any unspent money so this can be carried forward into 2023/24.
